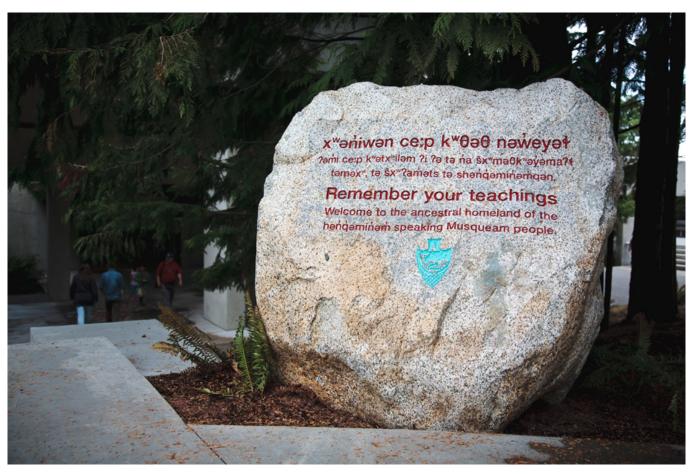

#### Access protocols & the AADPP

# Moving to a new funding model for digitization supporting outcomes beyond immediate public access by:

- Supporting preservation efforts for significant recordings
- Recognizing that development of access protocols must be based on community concerns for
  - Treaty, land claims and responses to resource development
  - Culturally defined rights that respect community practice
  - Language revitalization
- Recognizing communities' rights to tell their own stories to the public at large in accordance with their timelines



#### **Grant Adjudication**

- Consultation period
  - In-person visit with prospective applicant
- 12 applicants
- Themes
- 3 Projects to be funded:
  - Upper St'át'imc Language, Culture, and Education Centre (Lillooet)
  - Fort Nelson First Nation
  - Tsawwassen First Nation
- Our lessons learned during adjudication
  - What worked
  - What needs to shift
