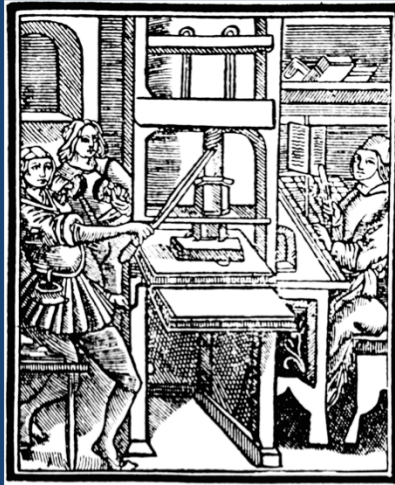

Gutenberg printing press – initiated an info revolution

- enabled and shaped PR, R, SR
- unleashed forces that transformed western civilization over next 600 years

HOW: lower cost of reproduction, higher accuracy



Digital revolution: CUBED

letting down our students

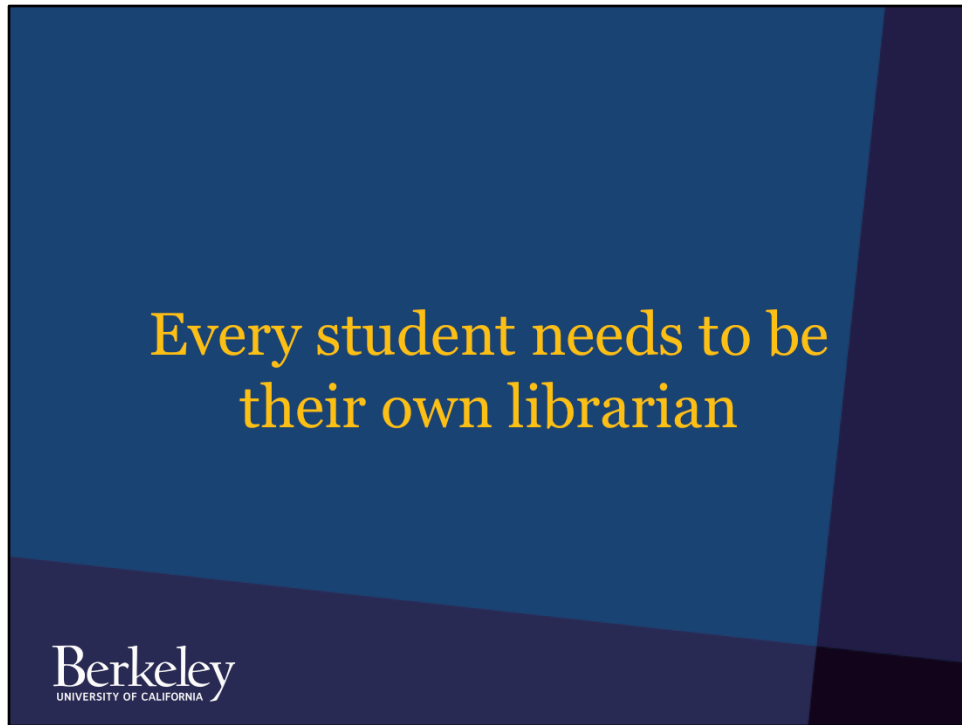
Much concern US presidential election affected by fake news

First, broaden our conception of information fluency

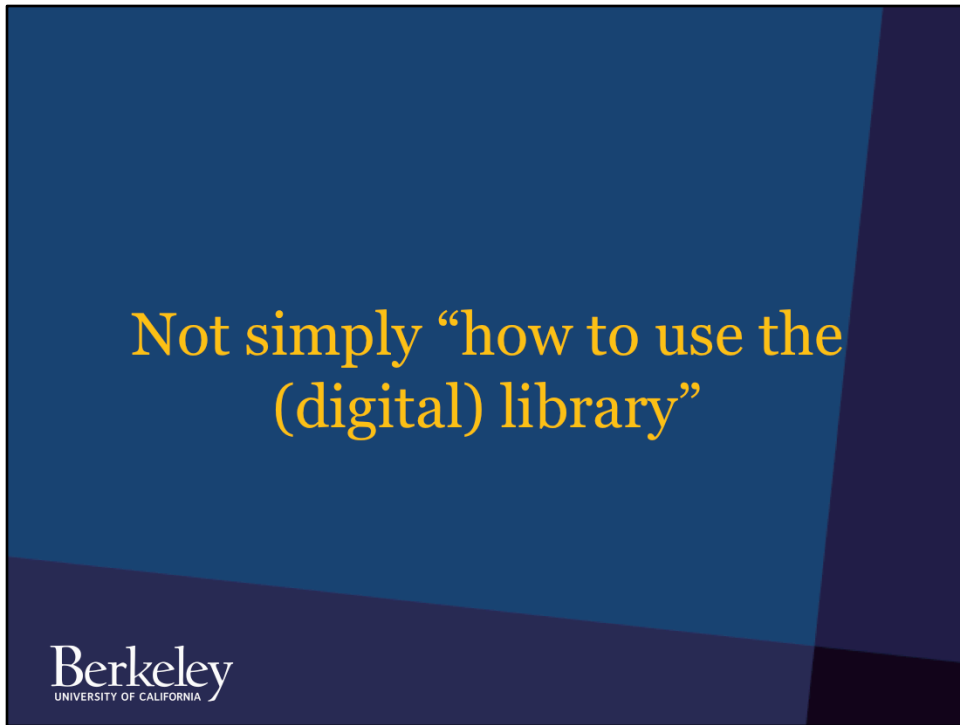
Second, support student mastery of information fluency

- security

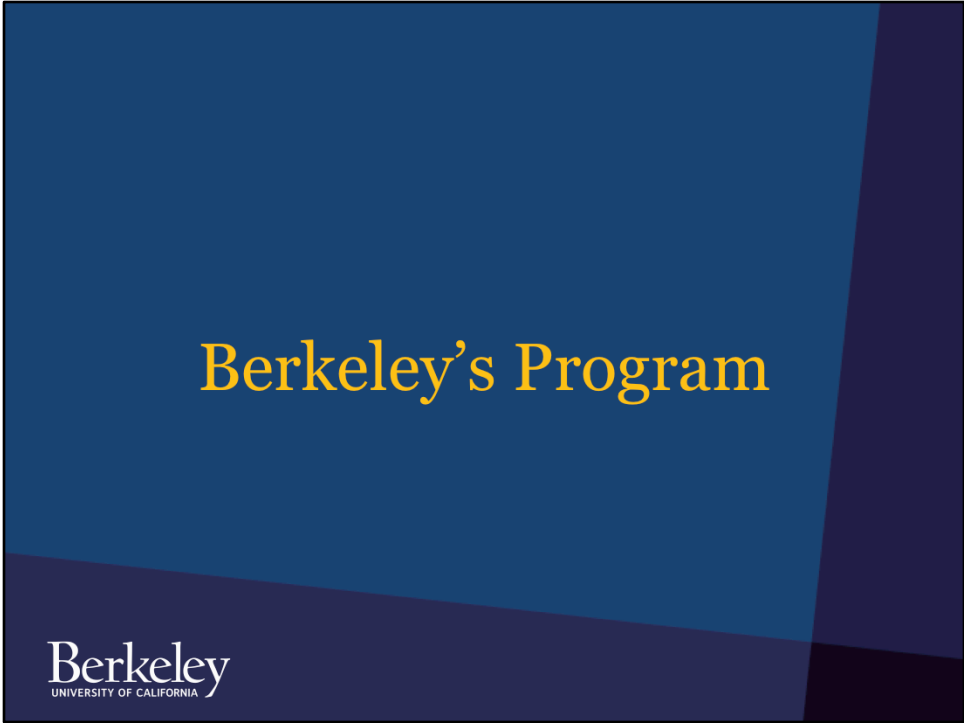

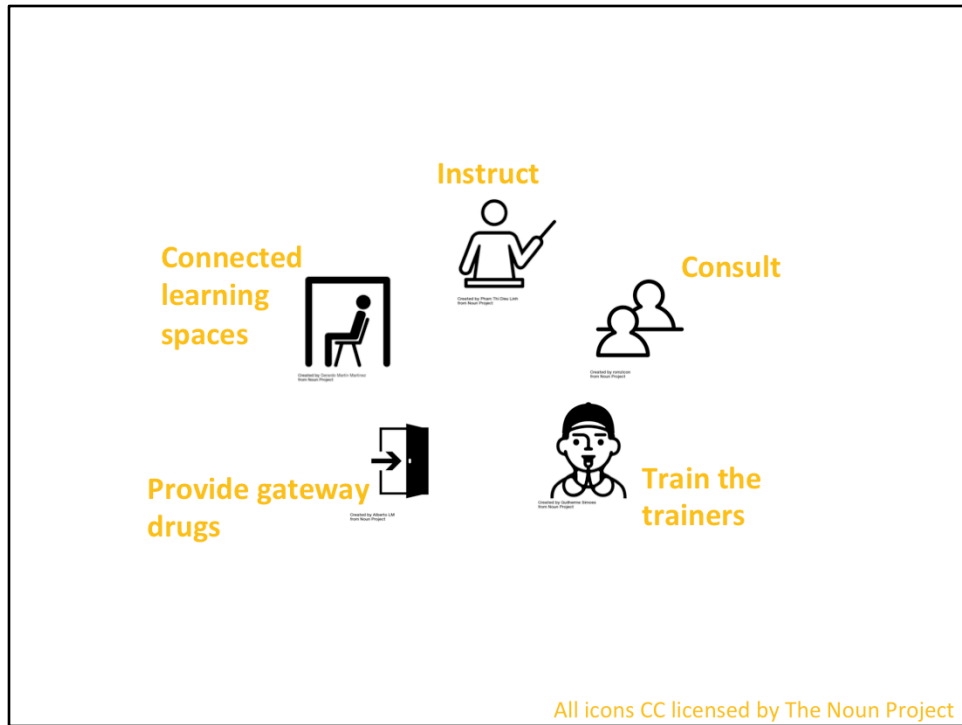
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Project DQ: Digital Intelligence Quotient for Each Child



Create a structured program



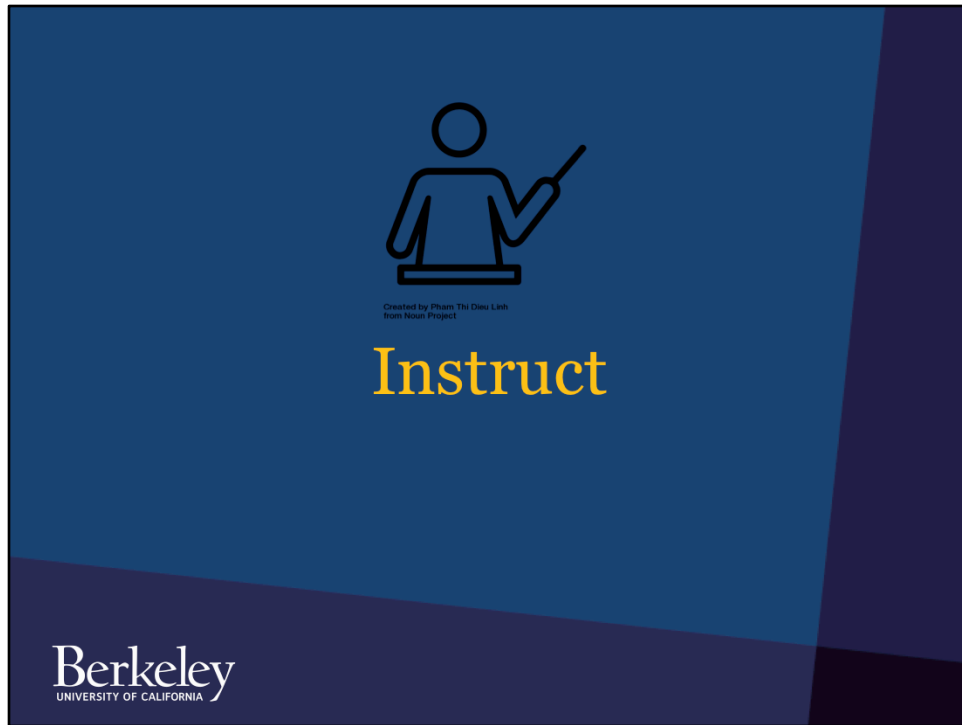
Instruct (by Xinh Studio)

Today:

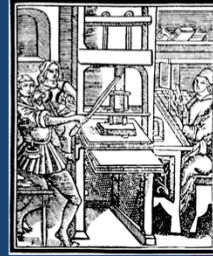
- new info techs arriving all the time
