Appointed by University Librarians, April 2005

Five members: John Reimer (Chair, UCLA), Luc Declerck (UCSD), Amy Kautzman (UCB), Patti Martin (CDL), Terry Ryan (UCLA)

Charge: Rethink how to provide bibliographic services

















Why now?

 Amazon, Google, iTunes are the standards against which we are judged

User expect simplicity and immediate reward



























Why now?

- Bibliographic systems are proliferating
- Bibliographic data is siloed
- Metadata is underutilized
- Shared services are difficult to develop
- Duplication of effort





















Increased recognition that:

- Bibliographic systems are the foundation of library services
- Metadata is valuable and strategic
- Libraries are filled with undiscoverable yet extremely valuable material
- It can be done, e.g. OCLC WorldCat, RedLightGreen, NCSU's catalog















Task Force Process

- Literature survey (61 items)
- Interviews (15)
- Review of emerging systems (30 sites)
- Inventory of potential actions (110)
- Recommendations (15 major, 34 detailed)
- Key design principles

The Report Strikes a Chord

Strong interest within the University of California

- Immediate community reaction
 - Blogs
 - Task Force members are interviewed
 - Invitations to present at conferences
 - Guest lectures at library schools



Gives voice to popular opinion

- Services must be user driven
- Services must be delivered where the users are
- Libraries need to act boldly to reclaim role in the information space
- Libraries have unique added value





















Consensus:

Next Generation Discovery Tools

- Take user directly to item
- Bring library to the user
- Faceted browsing
- Metadata important (topical subject, too)
- Single discovery interface:
 - all of UC
 - across the full information space
 - scope views



Consensus: Workflow Redesign

- Coordinate cataloging among campuses
- Redesign entire workflow, not just cataloging
- Adopt a single bibliographic system to support shared workflows



Consensus: Process

- Act now
- Involve wide range of library experts in implementation planning
- Involve users in planning



Next Steps: From vision to action

At the University of California

- Articulate consensus (in process)
- Identify options (in process)
- Next steps to be decided by University Librarians in Sept 2006



In the meantime

 Library of Congress commissioned report by Karen Calhoun – issued January 2006

 Indiana University released white paper on the Future of Cataloging - January 2006



Next Steps: From vision to action

At the Library of Congress

- External Advisory Committee on the Future of Cataloging (being constituted and charged)
- Will analyze reports: BSTF, LC, IU, etc.
- Include all major stakeholders: ALA, ARL, etc.
- Include representatives from Google, Yahoo, and Microsoft
