- > 1.2 million titles
- > 13,000 current journals

E-Resources:

- > 19,000 ejournals
- > 12,000 ebooks
- > 250 databases




Growth of E-Resources

The number of e-resources has grown more than 12 folds from 1999 to 2006










Library Portal

- Provides desktop single sign-on from campus network
- Single sign-on from portal to databases, ejournals, ebooks, myLINC, and e-forms
- Allows personalization of portal homepage based on preferences





- Launched in August 2004
- Introduced new user interface in Jan 2006
- Use BEA WebLogic 8.1 portal platform
- One-stop service for e-resources, my library records, and e-forms








Users can set preference for their favorite databases, ejournals, and ebooks by subject



Integrated Virtual Learning Environment (IVLE)

- IVLE is the university's e-learning portal through which NUS academics develop content and students access their educational resources, interact and learn.
- Students use IVLE widely and rate it highly






- In May 2003 the library leveraged on IVLE to provide electronic readings
- Readings can be accessed anytime, anywhere
- Includes both scanned documents and direct links to subscribed e-resources
- Restricts to students taking the course and ensures compliance with Singapore's copyright requirements




- List of modules a student has registered is displayed in My Module after login
- Reserve readings are listed under the heading 'Library Resources'





Readings are provided in a mixture of:

- PDF documents
- Persistent links to the HTML or PDF documents
- Hyperlinks to the online catalog records of books





Automatic alert system

 When professors add or amend their reading lists the system will send an email alert to the library highlighting the changes made to the list




Future plans
