- Promote democracy

## **US Military Intelligence Service**



Officers & enlisted Japanese Americans trained at secret US Army Japanese Language School aka "MIS" (Military Intelligence Service)

- 1921-2007, Nisei
- UHM Graduate in 1942
- MIS 1943-1944
- Military intelligence during WWII
- GHQ Censor 1945-1949

388 photos & 35 memorabilia



#### **Historical Context**

#### Japanese-Americans after Pearl Harbor Attack

- Suffered discrimination
- Recruited for military service
- Served during the Occupation & helped implement post-WWII US cultural policies, including censorship
